





Richard Raši is a Slovak physician and politician currently serving as Slovakia's Deputy Prime Minister for Investments and Information.

Born on April the 2nd 1971 in Kosice, Richard Raši studied medicine at the University of Pavol Jozef Šafárik from 1989, and obtained his medical degree in 1995. After specializing as a trauma surgeon he completed his masters degree in the field of public health at the Slovak Medical University in 2004. Six years later he received his PhD degree in the same field at Technical University of Košice.

Immediately after graduation, he started working as a trauma surgeon intern at the University Hospital of L. Pasteur in Kosice. By 2004, he had been promoted to Vice-director of that hospital's clinic of

traumatology.

From 2007, he worked as head of the Bratislava Faculty Hospital, until 2008, when he was appointed Minister of Health. In between the years, Rasi spent several months on internships abroad, working among others in the United States, Sweden and Switzerland.

A member of the Direction – Social Democracy (Slovak: Smer – sociálna demokracia) political party, Raši served as well as Mayor of the city of Košice. He also served as Minister of Health in the First cabinet of Robert Fico rom 3 June 2008 until 8 June 2010.

Raši was appointed Deputy Prime Minister for Investments and Information upon the ascension of Peter Pellegrini to the office of Prime Minister in March 2018. Along with the rest of the new Cabinet, he was approved by the National Council on 26 March 2018.

Olga Nachtmannova was born on July 14, 1963 in Povazska Bystrica. In 1987, she successfully completed her PhD at Belarusian State University in Minsk.

She is a long-time university lecturer at the University of Economics in Bratislava, she lectures on human resources management and work organization, which she also deals with in the field of scientific activities. As VEGA project manager, she also addressed the flexicurity issue in the context of the Lisbon Strategy (2010, 2020) as well as the Europe 2020 strategy with her team.

In 2006 - 2010 and 2012 - 2016 she was a member of the Committee on European Affairs and Committee on Education, Science, Youth and Sport as a Member of the National Council of the Slovak Republic for SMER – SD. Since 2007 she has been a member of the Permanent Delegation of the National Council of the Slovak Republic to the



Parliamentary Assembly of the Council of Europe. She has been the Head of Delegation since 2009.

She also received the parliamentary mandate in the 2016 parliamentary elections and worked in the Committee on European Affairs and in the Constitutional Committee as a Member of the National Council of the Slovak Republic. She was appointed Secretary of State for the SMER-SD party on 18 November 2016.

Joachim Bleicker studied Law at Göttingen University and Université de Lausanne. After obtaining his degree in 1984 and working as an Assistant at Göttingen University's Institute of Public International Law, he entered the German Diplomatic Service in 1987, serving 1987/88 as an exchange diplomat in the British Foreign and Commonwealth Office in London. 1989/90, he was a desk officer for Maritime Affairs and Tourism at the German Federal Foreign Office in Bonn and then again from 1993-1996 for Poland and the Czech Republic.

Early foreign postings included Warsaw/ Poland (German Minority Affairs, 1990-1993) and Washington/ USA (Europe, Asia and Oceania, 1996-2000, including one year as an exchange diplomat with the US State Department). Until 2003, Bleicker was Deputy Head of the

Born on 23 January 1956 in Câmpia Turzii (Cluj County, Romania), Mrs Steluţa Ahrire is, since 2016, the Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of Romania to the Slovak Republic. During her long diplomatic career, started in 1990, she has been all around the world, including as Chargé d'Affaires of Romania in the Kingdom of Thailand and the Slovak Republik, and as Deputy Chief of Mission in the United States of America.

She has been very active in the European sphere, working on many occasions at the Council of Europe and participating in numerous seminars and conferences on regional and international security, human rights and European integration issues.

Mrs Steluţa Ahrire is a graduate of the Academy of Economic Studies in Bucharest, Romania (Diploma in Economic Studies, Specialization in International Business and Economics) from where she obtained her PhD degree in International Business and Economics with a thesis



on "The Concept of Economic Security in the New Global Political and Economic Environment"

She published several articles on international security, world economy and European integration and has been decorated with the National Order "For Merit" in the Rank of Knight, awarded by the President of Romania, in 2002.

He was in charge of the main policy documents in the field of VET since 2010: Commission Communication on the future of European Cooperation in the field of VET (2010), Commission Staff Working Document on Excellence in VET (2012) and Riga Conclusions on the new medium-term priorities in the field of VET (2015).

James Calleja

Professor James Calleja has been involved in Vocational Education and Training since 2001. Before his appointment as Principal and CEO of the Malta College of Arts, Science and Technology in June 2018, Mr Calleja was Director of the European Centre for the Development of Vocational Training (Cedefop) from 2013 to May 2018. Before joining Cedefop, he served as Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Education and Employment in his native Malta from 2011 to 2013. Professor Calleja is currently the President of EfVET.

In 2005 he was entrusted with the setting up of the Malta Qualifications Council where he served as Chief Executive up to December 2010. He is an Associate Professor and served as Council member of the University of Malta.

Prof Calleja is a graduate of the Universities of Malta, Padua (Italy) and Bradford (UK), from where he obtained his PhD in International Relations. Since 2001, he is an accredited commercial mediator with CEDR (London).



In 2001, he was appointed Administrative Director of the Malta College of Arts, Science and Technology and in 2004 he moved to the European Training Foundation in Turin. He started his professional life at the Foundation for International Studies of the University of Malta (1986-1995) followed by other upward career moves to the United Nations International Institute on Aging (1995-1998) and to the Ministry of Economic Services Malta (1998-2001). He represented Malta on the European Qualifications Framework Advisory Group, on CEDEFOP's Governing Board and on the Bologna Follow-Up Group.

A prolific writer, Prof Calleja has published books and articles and has edited various publications. He is the co-author of the Malta Referencing Report of the Malta Qualifications Framework to the EQF and EHEA. He has participated in international events in various countries in Europe, North America, South-East Asia, Australia, Canada, Africa, South Africa, the Middle East and in the Mediterranean region.
