Objectives:

General objectives:

- To promote **innovation** in education (methods, practices, policies);
- To contribute to the strengthening of **Europe's innovation capacity** by promoting innovation in education and training;
- To Create a systemic change through fostering innovation at both practice and policy-level;
- To support **forward-looking ideas** focusing on key topics and priorities at EU level in one or more sectors.
- To ensure at EU level **the sustainable exploitation and/or transferability** of innovative project results into different contexts and audiences.

Specific objectives:

- To identify, develop, test and assess **innovative approaches** aiming at improving education and **training systems**, as well as, the **effectiveness of education policies and practices**;
- To launch pilot actions;
- To support **transnational cooperation and mutual learning** (including capacity-building of relevant stakeholders).

Activities should contribute to:

- Improve quality, efficiency and equity of education and training systems;
- Improve effectiveness of policies in the field of education and training;
- Support the implementation of EU Frameworks and legal initiatives as well as country-specific recommendations from the European Semester;
- Improved evidence and understanding on target group(s), learning and teaching situations and effective methodologies and tools that can inspire and stimulate innovation at system level;
- Develop knowledge to support evidence-based policy;
- Trigger behavioural shifts at EU level.

Indicative activities:

- Action research, mapping work, producing large-scale sectoral or cross-sectoral outputs;
- Transnational capacity-building activities (training, the analysis of policy contexts, policy-research);
- Pilot activities to test innovative solutions;
- Large-scale transnational events or networking activities;
- Exploitation activities to spread results to the educational community or sector;
- Think-tank activities, researching and experimenting with innovative ideas.

Award Criteria

Eligible proposals will be assessed on the basis of the following criteria:

- *Relevance of the measure and contribution to the objectives of the call for proposals* (30 points)
- *Quality of the project design and implementation* (30 points)
- *Quality of the partnership and the cooperation arrangements* (20 points)
- *Impact, dissemination and sustainability* (20 points)

Priority 6: Development of national registries of quality-assured and labour market relevant training opportunities

Projects will identify methods and mechanisms to help ensure that such registries, once operational, reach a significant number of users because they:

- Improve the communication between the “world of education and training” and the “world of work”;
- Strike a good balance between ensuring quality and providing a diverse offer of opportunities that is responsive to labour market needs;
- Combine simplicity from the user perspective with appropriate flexibility at the “back end”/concerning the included opportunities;
- Catalyse additional investments for training.
- Are interoperable with other national registries and the Europass Platform thanks to their use of the standards of the European Learning Model (data scheme).

Priority 7: Supporting the Pact for Skills

- Develop and support governance structures or arrangements connecting members within the same Pact for Skills partnership;
- Develop and support cooperation of big companies with SMEs, and among SMEs that are members of the same Pact for Skills partnership in the field of training;
- Support the definition, implementation, and monitoring of the concrete commitments that the Pact for Skills partnership has made and will make, such as:
 - Gathering skills intelligence,
 - Upskilling of low-skilled people,
 - Reskilling people for new tasks in their jobs, reskilling of people from other sectors with skills transferable to the own sector, with a particular view on integrating refugees from Ukraine into the labour market.
